Learning English with Frances King

We are known as a friendly school and we try to make you feel at home and help you to enjoy your time in London. We will ensure you learn well before, during and after your course in London.

Take an online English test

You can check your language level with our online English test. The test is in three sections: grammar, writing and if you have a computer with a microphone you can do a speaking test too. You will also save time on your arrival in London. Go to: www.francesking.co.uk. If you do not have access to a computer with Internet, you can just arrive in London, and complete the test then.

Online help before you come to London Our online service offers:

First day

On your first day you will have a test of your spoken English with a Director of Studies or senior teacher, who will choose a suitable class for you. We will try to get you to your class as soon as possible on your first day. If you feel your class is not quite right you can talk to the Director of Studies about changing.

You will receive a student card and "Welcome Pack", including:

- Frances King Student Guide with information about life in London and how the school can help you
- Current social programme
- Stationery
- Information about London transport

The first day is usually a Monday. In summer we may invite you to come to the school on the Sunday before your first day to save time on Monday and to avoid missing lessons.

Induction meeting

Early in your first week you will attend an induction meeting. You will receive more information and advice about:

- Learning English at Frances King
- School services and facilities

In the classroom

The emphasis is on spoken communication in English.

- Grammar and vocabulary is introduced and practised in a systematic way.
- Language skill lessons provide practice in listening, reading and writing as well as spoken English
- Pronunciation practice and correction are also a part of lessons
- Teachers use a variety of teaching techniques including whole class teaching, and group and pair work
- Some classes also include multimedia based lessons
- Your teacher will provide learning materials in most classes. If you are taking an examination course you will need to buy a course book from the school reception. You can also buy grammar practice books for extra homework.






Internship Programmes

Most companies will interview you before offering you work. You must start the application process early enough to ensure that we receive all documents six weeks before your internship begins.
