



It is an ideal place for students, with a busy social and cultural life, designed around young people. With a population of 100,000 residents, and 20,000 university students, it is small enough to be relaxed and friendly and big enough to ensure you will never be bored.

It is a wonderful place to be, whichever time of the year you come, and London is just 100 kilometres away – only 45 minutes by train.

Why Studio Cambridge?

We are one of the longest-established English language schools in Britain.

We have been part of Cambridge's educational scene for 56 years and we are well known and respected in the Cambridge community.

Hills Road Sixth Form College

During the summer (July and August)

Classes are held at the renowned Hills Road Sixth Form College (HRSFC). This is one of the most respected schools in Cambridge. It was the first college in the UK to be awarded "outstanding status" by government inspectors.

HRSFC is just 10 minutes' walk from our main school and has excellent, modern facilities. These include:

Accommodation Homestays – living with local people

Living with a host family in their private home – a homestay - is the best way to experience England at first hand. It will enrich your understanding of the English language, our customs and culture, and provide you with a friendly environment.

We know our homestay hosts

Every host is known to us personally and is visited at least once each year. They understand our students' needs for a relaxing and friendly environment, a clean and comfortable bedroom, good food, and a quiet place for study.

We will select your homestay based on your own needs, such as hosts with or without children and pets, or people who are able to cater to dietary or religious requirements. Our hosts are typical of British and Cambridge society as a whole: of different ages and occupations and from a variety of ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Most importantly, they will give you a warm welcome and provide you with help and support throughout your stay.

Any other student we place at your homestay will not be a native speaker of your language, so that your only means of communication is English.

Homestays are normally located no more than 30 minutes from school on foot, by bicycle or using the frequent bus services.

Your bedroom

You will have a single room, although double rooms are available for couples. Your clothes will be washed and your bed linen and towels will be changed once per week.

Your meals

Your homestay hosts will provide breakfast and dinner from Monday to Friday and all meals at weekends. Lunch is available in school, at the Studio Café from Monday to Friday. It offers a choice of hot and cold food and vegetarian options. The typical cost of a two-course lunch is £4.00. A sandwich costs around £1.50.

A choice of homestays

There are three types of homestay accommodation:

- Homestay Three Star ★★★
 Good, clean accommodation.
- Homestay Four Star ****
 As above, but of a particularly high standard, in a larger home or with additional facilities.
- Homestay Five Star *****
 Executive-standard, usually in a large house and typically providing a bathroom for your private use. This accommodation is most suitable for mature students

Residential accommodation

Self-catering, residential accommodation is available year-round. Please contact us for details.

Student Ages

The minimum age for participation in our Intensive English courses is 16 years. However, at certain times of the year, we run our Sir George Language and Activity Programme at our main school in Cambridge (see page 35).

If you are aged 19 or more years, your classmates will not be younger than 16 years. If you are aged 16 to 18 years, some classmates may be 14 to 17 years of age.

Travel to the continent of Europe

Cambridge is just 50 kilometres from London's Stansted airport. There are regular, and very inexpensive, flights from Stansted to many major cities throughout Europe.

Choosing the right course

There are five different courses from which to choose. Two are in general English and three in preparation for internationally recognised examinations and qualifications.

Once you are at the school you can, with the approval of our Director of Studies, move from one course to another.

The EFL-20 course (page 11)

This course comprises 20 lessons (15 hours) of teaching each week, and is for students who do not want a more intensive course. It is in general English, with no specialisation.

The EFL-28 course (page 13)

The EFL-28 course comprises 28 lessons (21 hours) of teaching each week and is our most popular programme. The course includes various specialisations (afternoon options) in:

- Language skills
- Special interests
- English for Business
- Academic English
- Reading and writing

Depending on your level, and the length of your course, you can combine these options to ensure that the course meets your personal needs.

Cambridge Examination Course (page 17) IELTS Examination Course (page 18) TOEIC Examination Course (page 18)

These courses are also of 28 lessons (21 hours) of teaching each week. They run at specific times during the year. You can combine these courses with the EFL-28 course at no additional cost.

What is included in the course fees?

Our fees for the Intensive Courses are divided into three. These are the services we provide in each of the three areas:

Why do we include social activities in the fees?

You are coming to England to learn, and to speak, English. Therefore, what you do in your free time, after class, is very important. We include five activities each week, at no additional charge, because they will help you to socialise with your friends from class, to make friends from around the world – and to continue to speak English.





English Course EFL-20



The English Course (EFL-20) is in general English, with no specialisation. It consists of 20 lessons each week, typically from 09:15 to 12:45 each day, Monday to Friday. It is ideal for students who do not wish to take a more intensive course, preferring to have their afternoons free.

The content of the course differs according to the level of each class. However, all courses include the study of grammar, speaking and pronunciation, writing skills, and listening and reading comprehension.

Methodology

We adapt our teaching to the needs and learning styles of our students, following three guiding principles:

- 1. The teaching will be balanced with practice you will learn and practise English, with an emphasis on speaking;
- 2. Lessons will be centred around you you won't spend all your time listening to the teacher but will be busy using English in the classroom;
- 3. The language we teach will be recycled we won't allow you to forget what you have learnt.

Each week you will be given a progress test to check your learning. As your English improves, you will move to a higher level.

Tutorials

Self-study

In the Learning Centre, you will have access to a wide range of materials, books, CD-ROMs, websites, CDs, cassettes and newspapers to use to improve your English. The Learning Centre has active WIFI – useful if you are bringing your own laptop.


Studio Cambridge works with schools, colleges and universities throughout the world in providing courses for student groups.

English Course EFL-28



Studio Cambridge main school

Morning lessons

All students taking this course take the EFL-20 English course during the mornings and then study their choice of five options during the afternoons.

Afternoon lessons

Choose from 5 options

The afternoon part of the course comprises 8 lessons (6 hours) per week. The lessons are held from 13:45 to 15:15 every weekday except Friday, which is a free afternoon.

You may choose one or more options, depending on your interests and your level of English:

Option One:

Language skills – use the English you have learned in your morning lessons;

Option Two:

Special interest – learn English by following one of your special interests;

Option Three:

English for Business – develop your use of English in the world of international business;

Option Four:

Academic English – specialise in the English used at universities and in research papers; prepare for an Academic English examination, such as IELTS or ELAE;

Option Five:

Reading and Writing – of particular help to students whose mother tongue does not use the Roman alphabet.

Case Studies

Mehmet from Saudi Arabia

Mehmet wanted to enter a British university to study Engineering. He took the EFL-28 course, with Option Five (reading and writing), followed by Option Four (Academic English). He then took our specialised IELTS Examination Course, scored 6.5 and was accepted into university.

Maria from Spain

Maria worked at an international bank in Madrid and needed to improve her English, with a particular emphasis on Business. She also needed an official qualification to show to her employers.

English Course EFL-28 Options



EFL-28 Option One - Language Skills

This option helps you to use your English, building on your morning lessons.

- Each lesson focuses on one of the four main language skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing.
- Exciting, practical materials and techniques are used, such as radio interviews, magazine articles, songs and films clips, followed by a discussion of their content.
- There is additional emphasis on vocabulary and pronunciation.

EFL-28 Option Two – Special Interest

This option covers a range of techniques to improve your English, based on topics of special interest. As you can change your options every week, you can join this course whenever the topic is of particular interest to you. Topics include:

- English literature read some of our greatest writers and poets, discuss the meaning of their works and learn new vocabulary.
- British history learn about our kings and queens, how parliament was established, wars, famous British personalities.
- Film studies watch extracts from great movies, see and listen to famous actors, and discuss the themes behind the stories.
- British festivals what was the original "Mothers' Day", where do our Christmas traditions come from, what is "Bonfire Night"?
- Correct pronunciation study the sounds of the English language from all parts of the world, and learn techniques to achieve a good English accent.
- Creative writing use your English to write a short story or poem for a magazine.

EFL-28 Option Three - English for Business

This option will help you use English in the world of international business. It includes the essential language and presentational skills, both oral and written, used in areas such as:

- Sales negotiation
- Money and banking
- International trade
- Management
- Marketing and advertising
- Business letters and reports
- Chairing and participating in meetings
- Minutes and agendas
- Interpreting graphs and describing trends



Intensive English Courses - Year round - Adults

EFL-28 Option Four - Academic English

This option focuses on the specialised language required in the academic world. It is also excellent preparation for examinations such as IELTS, ELAE, and the University of Cambridge examinations. Whether or not you intend to take an examination, this option is an excellent choice if you need to develop your knowledge of formal written English.

The course includes:

- The formal lexis and structures used in academic writing
- Describing graphs, charts and diagrams
- Taking notes from lectures
- · Planning, organising and writing essays
- Understanding scientific texts
- Reading and writing under time constraints
- Prioritising
- Study skills

EFL-28 Option Five – Reading and Writing

This option is especially useful for students whose native language does not use the Roman alphabet or who need particular help in developing their reading and writing skills.

It is a very popular option for students intending to take an internationally recognised examination (such as the University of Cambridge examinations or IELTS) or who will use their English for formal, written communication.



Projected Student Progress - How much will I learn?

How much you will learn, and how long it will take, depends on many factors. These include your present knowledge, how hard you work and your natural ability.

The following is the progress shown by four students – Carlos, Marie, Mohammed and Oric – who each started at a different level and studied with us for different periods of time. The middle (blue) line follows their average progress, which takes them from the Beginner to the Advanced level in less than a year.



Examination Courses

University of Cambridge Examination Course (CAM-28)

This course is designed not just for students wishing to take the University of Cambridge examinations, but also for people who want a highly structured and demanding course with a slightly greater emphasis on grammar and writing.

The courses include:

If you wish to take the examination in Cambridge on Saturday, March 6 we will extend your accommodation in Cambridge for that night at no additional cost.


The June and December examinations are held on a Tuesday or Wednesday. There will, therefore, be no teaching during the last week in which you take the examination. Our course fees are therefore calculated on 12 weeks of study and 13 weeks of accommodation, meals and activities. Please see the enclosed leaflet for the fees.

The cost of the examination (which is optional) is not included in the course fees. It is estimated at £100 and should be paid at the school.

Specialised books

The Cambridge Examination Courses (CAM-28) require the use of specialised textbooks. The cost is estimated at £35 per course and should be paid in the school

IELTS Examination Course (IELTS-28)

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) examination is an internationally recognised qualification for entry to universities and colleges throughout the English-speaking world. Our IELTS Examination course is ideal preparation and has proven to be highly effective. All 168 lessons (6 weeks at 28 lessons per week) concentrate exclusively on the examination.

The course is designed to ensure you achieve at least the minimum score for entry to a degree course at a British university, usually 5.5. You will need to be at least at the Upper Intermediate level (IELTS 5.0) to start this course. However, it is also suitable for students aiming for 7.0 or higher.

If your level of English is well below your target score, you should start your studies on the EFL-28 course (see page 13) with Option Four: Academic English and transfer to the IELTS examination course towards the end of your studies.

Examination dates and additional accommodation

If you wish to take the examination in Cambridge, we will extend your accommodation in Cambridge for the Saturday night at no additional cost. The cost of the examination (which is optional) is not included in the course fees. It is estimated at £100 and should be paid at the school.

The course uses specialised course books at an additional cost of approximately £35 per course, to be paid in the school.

TOEIC Examination Course (TOEIC-28)

This course prepares you for the Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC).

TOEIC is used throughout the world as an assessment of English language proficiency. It provides potential employers with a guide to candidates' skills in using English for communication with international partners or clients.

The course comprises 20 lessons per week of general English study and 8 lessons per week of specialised study for the TOEIC examination.

It lasts for just two weeks and should, therefore, be combined with at least two weeks study on the EFL-28 course with Option Four (Academic English) – see page 16.

Examination fees

The cost of the TOEIC examination is not included in the fees. It is estimated at £50.00 (at a specially discounted rate) and should be paid in the school.

Accommodation and meals





The town

Bishop's Stortford is an historic market town midway between Cambridge (50 kilometres) and London (60 kilometres).

It has a population of only 38,000 people and enjoys one of the highest standards of living in Great Britain. It is a very attractive and trouble-free place to live. It is also ideally situated for visits and excursions to some of England's most famous sights.

It is a perfect place for children aged 10 to 15 years: safe, and very English in character. The programme attracts children from many different countries each summer and has a delightful international atmosphere.

Our partner school

The Hockerill Anglo-European College (HAEC) in Bishops Stortford was established in the 1850s. Today it is one of the country's top international staterun colleges, with a strong emphasis on language studies and learning appropriate for the international world.

Studio Cambridge is proud to be associated with the college. We have been running our Sir Henry programme at HAEC every summer for the past 11 years. We take over the entire premises of the college for the months of July and August.

Safety and security

The city of Ely

Ely (pronounced to rhyme with "freely") is a beautiful, peaceful town in the heart of the Cambridgeshire countryside: the ideal setting for children. It is 25 kilometres north of Cambridge and 120 kilometres from London.

Its magnificent cathedral, established in 1083, dominates the city and makes this one of the finest and most unspoilt mediaeval cities in Britain. Many of the mediaeval buildings are part of The King's School's teaching centres and student residences.

The centre of the town has a traditional English 'High Street' with a wide range of shops and a classic market square. Although it is a city, Ely has a population of only 15,000 people and is often described as a 'village'; not surprising when everyone you meet soon becomes a friend.

The King's School

There are few schools in the world that can boast a history like that of The King's School Ely.

The school was founded over 1,000 years ago and King Edward the Confessor, who died in 1066, was educated in the magnificent buildings around Ely Cathedral which are still used by the school today.

Our Sir George Programme is more intensive than our other Language and Activity Programmes. It is designed for young people (ages 14 to 17) who wish to visit England during the academic year, and who want to combine intensive English language study with a programme of activities and excursions.

Cambridge is a year-round city and has a special atmosphere between September and June. This is when the city is full of students attending the University of Cambridge.

Location and facilities

The programme is run at our main school at 6 Salisbury Villas, Cambridge. Studio Cambridge is in Victorian buildings more than 100 years old. It is in an ideal location, 10 minutes' walk from Cambridge city centre and 400 metres from the central train station.

The timetable

20 of these lessons are held in the mornings from Monday to Friday. The content of these lessons differs according to the level of each class. However, all programmes include the intensive study of:

- Grammar
- · Speaking skills
- Pronunciation and intonation
- Listening comprehension
- Writing skills
- Reading comprehension

Afternoon sessions

The remaining 8 sessions – comprising a minimum of six hours - are held in the afternoons. These sessions involve project work and can include:

- English theatre study and act in a play
- Guide to Cambridge research and write a guide to Cambridge for your friends
- Radio show write and then record your own radio show
- English magazine plan and write a short story

Student Ages

The Sir George Programme is run at our main school in Cambridge which is used for adult learners (see pages 7 – 18)

Participants may sometimes be taught in classes with adult students up to a maximum of 18 years of age.









The town

Our Sir William programme is held at the Richmondupon-Thames campus of Richmond the American International University in London.

Richmond-upon-Thames is considered by many people to be the most attractive area of London. It has been a favourite retreat of Royalty, the rich and the famous for hundreds of years.

With its Royal parks and historic houses, the beautiful Thames riverfront, a very high standard of living and a lively town centre, this is the best location for young people in London.

In and around Richmond are several very famous sights including Hampton Court Palace, home of Henry VIII, the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew, and Twickenham, home of English rugby.

Central London, with all its famous sights, is less than 20 minutes by train or "tube" - London's underground railway.

And getting here is easy. London Heathrow airport is just 20 kilometres away.

The University and local facilities

Richmond, the American International University in London, is an exceptional and very exciting academic institution. It is accredited in both the U.S. and the U.K. and provides an American education in a British setting.

The University was established in 1843. It later became a part of London University and then, in 1971, became the international university that it is today.

The impressive 19th century buildings are set in a beautiful, leafy campus of 2 hectares (5 acres) on the top of Richmond Hill. They contain the Taylor Library, classrooms, computer laboratories with a total of 140 computers with free e-mail and Internet, dining hall, students' common rooms, an auditorium, and administration and faculty offices.

On-campus sports facilities are limited: a basketball and tennis court and a weights-training room.

All the attractions of Richmond and, of course, London itself are within easy reach.

Living on campus

Richmond University offers very comfortable student accommodation. All students attending this programme live on-campus; homestays are not available.

The accommodation includes:

- A single bedroom, or a bedroom shared by one other Studio Cambridge student of the same sex and who does not speak the same language
- A shared bathroom, with toilet and shower
- All meals (3 meals and an evening snack each day)
- · Laundry facilities*
- A change of bed linen once per week

*You will have to wash your own clothes (under our supervision), but there is no additional charge. You should bring your own towels.

Two courses are available

Our Sir William Programme gives you two options:

THE STANDARD PROGRAMME

with 15 hours each week of English lessons

or

THE INTENSIVE PROGRAMME

with 21 hours each week of English lessons.

If you choose the Intensive Programme, the extra hours of English lessons will take the place of some afternoon activities. There is no difference in price between the Standard and Intensive programmes.





These Terms and Conditions apply both to the student and to his or her parent or guardian if the student is under the age of 18 years (the person who signs the Application Form). The words "you" and "your", therefore, apply to both the student and his or her parent or legal guardian. The text in **black** refers to all students. Text in **blue** refers to students applying for, or taking, our Intensive English Courses. Text in **green** refers to students applying for, or taking, our Language and Activity Programmes.

Your application

This brochure and the Course Fees and Application leaflet supersede all previous versions.

It is our policy to deal with all matters relating to your enrolment in a fair and open manner.

We undertake to offer our courses and services as described in this brochure. We do not accept responsibility for the provision of any services that are not expressly mentioned in the brochure.

All courses are offered subject to demand.

Where insufficient bookings lead us to cancel any course mentioned in the brochure, we will make every effort to offer you an alternative course.

If we are unable to accept your application for enrolment, we will offer you an alternative course or course start date or will suggest a similar course at a comparable school. If these are not acceptable to you, we will refund all monies paid.

We reserve the right not to accept any application. In the event that your application is declined, all monies received will be refunded in full.

Once your application has been received, and the enrolment confirmed, a binding contract exists between you and Studio Cambridge.

Once a contract exists, all fees are due for the full period of your course. Payments may not be made in installments.

The person signing the application takes responsibility for paying all required fees.

Fees must be received by Studio Cambridge no less than four weeks before the start of your course. Failure to comply with our payment terms may result in your enrolment being cancelled.

In compliance with British government regulations, the School will not accept cash payments in excess of €15,000 or their equivalent.

We reserve the right not to admit you to a course where the appropriate payment has not been received.

You must pay any bank charges incurred in making the payment to the school. Any change which results in additional charges must be paid for before the change is implemented.

Visas

If you come from a country whose nationals are required to be in possession of a visa to enter the United Kingdom, it is your responsibility to obtain that visa. On receipt of your application, plus the deposit or full fees, we will confirm receipt of the application and a place on the course will be kept open for you. The booking itself will not be confirmed until you inform the School that you are in possession of a visa.

On request, we will give you a letter confirming that your application has been received or a "CAS" (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies). These can be used to support your application for a visa.

If your application for a visa is unsuccessful, we will refund all monies paid on receipt of a copy of the letter of refusal from the British authorities (British Consulate or Visa Section of a British Embassy). If an appeal process is available to you, we will only make the refund when the appeal has been unsuccessful.

Your course

All students are expected to complete the course in which they have enrolled and to attend all classes. If you fail to do so we may advise the British authorities (the Home Office) of your non-compliance with these conditions.

If you are dissatisfied with a course, or any aspect of the services offered by Studio Cambridge, you must bring that dissatisfaction to the attention of the Principal or Course Director as soon as possible in order that a solution may be found without delay.

Once a complaint has been brought to our attention we will make every effort to resolve the problem within 24 hours.

If you are still not happy with the situation you may ask for the matter to be referred to the Operations Director, who will give a decision within 24 hours. We will not accept a complaint after the end of the course, if it has not been brought to our attention as explained above.

We expect all our students to be well motivated, polite and considerate towards others, especially their homestay hosts, and to observe such rules as are at the time in force

We reserve the right to ask any student who does not comply with 25 above to leave the course. In this case, no refund of fees will be made, and any extra costs involved will be the responsibility of the student or his or her parents or sponsor.

We reserve the right to ask any student whose course attendance is unsatisfactory to leave the programme. In this case, no refund of fees will be made.

In the event that a student is required to leave a course, we will inform the appropriate authorities (such as the British Home Office).

By enrolling you on a Studio Cambridge course, your parents/guardians are granting you permission to attend any activities organised by the school.

If your English is at the Beginner level and in the unlikely event that there are no other students at your level, we reserve the right to offer you private lessons in lieu of group lessons until you have reached the appropriate level. There will be no additional charge, but the number of private lessons will be provided at a ratio of 1 private lesson = 3 group lessons.

We do not accept liability for the loss of, or damage to, any person's property while on the School's premises. We do not accept any liability for loss or damage in which our students are involved.

We will hold you liable for any wilful damage you may cause and you will be asked to pay for the cost of repair or replacement.

With a minimum of four weeks' notice and the agreement of the Director of Studies or Principal, students on courses of 20 weeks or longer may take a break in their studies. Such holidays may only be taken if they begin and end on weekends. Accommodation and tuition fees will not be charged during this period. Subject to your hosts' agreement, you may return to, and leave your belongings at, your homestay. In this case, a fee will be charged.

We shall not be liable to you in the event that any service contracted to be supplied becomes impossible to supply because of any circumstances, such as industrial dispute, which are outside our control.

For students taking an Intensive English Course

Cancellation of your application

If we receive cancellation of your course, in writing, more than four weeks before the course starts, you will be responsible for paying just the Registration Fee (£70.00).

If you cancel a course, in writing, and we receive this notification less than four weeks before the course starts, you will be responsible for paying the Registration Fee and Deposit (a total of £300.00).

If we do not receive your cancellation in writing, or do so after the course in which you are enrolled has started, your cancellation will be treated as "termination" of the course. The conditions pertaining to termination are given below.

If you apply for a visa and your application is unsuccessful, we will refund all monies paid as described in these Conditions

Termination of your course or accommodation

If you wish to withdraw from your course (the lessons) once it has started, you must give four weeks' written notice or make payment of Tuition fees in lieu of notice. A refund will then be made of 50% of the Tuition fees for the unused portion of the course in excess of the four weeks' notice period.

If you wish to withdraw from your accommodation it will be kept available, and must be paid, until the Saturday of the week after you give us notice. A refund will then be made of 100% of the Accommodation fees remaining from that Saturday onward.

Please note: the insurance policy (included in the fees) covers you for cancellation or withdrawal from a course due to illness or other compelling reasons. If you are eligible for a refund under the provisions of this insurance, no further refund will be made by the School. Details of the insurance are available from Studio Cambridge.

For students taking a Language and Activity Programme

Cancellation of your application

If we receive cancellation of your course, in writing, more than four weeks before the course starts, you will be responsible for paying just the deposit (F300.00)

If you cancel your course less than four weeks before the course starts, or if you fail to cancel, you will be responsible for paying the full fees for your course. If you apply for a visa and your application is unsuccessful, we will refund all monies paid as described in these Conditions

Termination of your course

No refunds will be made for early withdrawal from a course.

Please note: the insurance policy (included in the fees) covers you for cancellation or withdrawal from a course due to illness or other compelling reasons. If you are eligible for a refund under this insurance, no further refund will be made by the School. Details of the insurance are available from Studio Cambridge

Refunds

Refunds will be made only to the person (such as a parent) or organisation (such as a Studio Cambridge agent) from whom we received the fees. Refunds can only be made to you if you originally paid the fees directly to Studio Cambridge yourself. All refunds will be made to the original payer's bank account or credit card and will not be made in cash.

Refunds will not be given for any part of the programme (such as an excursion) missed because of your arrival, departure or other travel arrangements.

All refunds will be made in £ Sterling or € Euros, at the discretion of the school. Any bank or other charges payable will be deducted from the money refunded to you.

Any refunds made will be based on the published fees for the length of the course taken.

Your agreement to these terms and conditions

By signing the application form, you or your parents/guardians, authorise Studio Cambridge to take appropriate action in the case of a medical emergency and acknowledge that the person signing the application form is responsible for paying all costs incurred. You or your parents/guardians also grant permission to any medical practitioner to examine you, treat you and to make referrals as required. You or your parents/guardians also grant permission for Studio Cambridge to include you in photographic images (whether still or moving) of the school and to use the images for the promotion of the school in brochures and on the web site.
