THE LANGUAGE COURSE

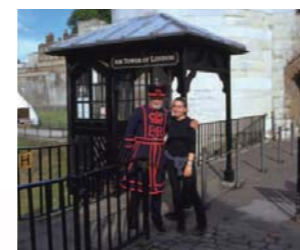
The London Life Sample Programme:

Monday

British Museum – see the Mummies, Elgin Marbles and over 10,000 years of world history.

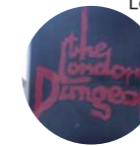


Thursday

Friday

Monday
The London Eye – see the city from the world's largest Ferris wheel and take a walk past the Palace of Westminster, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, 10 Downing Street and Trafalgar Square.

Tuesday
The Museum of London – 10,000 years of London's history from the stone age and the Romans to modern culture.

Wednesday
A stroll through Royal Regent's Park, along its famous canal and into Camden's trendy markets.

Thursday
Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, Sir Francis Drake's Golden Hinde and a walk along the River Thames' South Bank Festival Centre.



Friday
Royal Academy of Art, Piccadilly Circus, Eros and Burlington Arcade – London's iconic student Mecca plus Britain's very first shopping arcade.

Tuesday
